Synopsis

Episode 1: Us?! Transform?! Unreal!!

Nagisa Misumi and Honoka Yukishiro are in their 2nd year of middle school (8th grade) at the Girls' Division of Verone Academy. They are in the same homeroom but do not have much in common since Nagisa is a "jock" and Honoka is a "brain." One day, when Nagisa goes home after lacrosse practice, she sees hundreds of shooting stars from her window. As she quickly makes her wishes, a shining packet flies into her room. It is Mepple, a small creature from the Garden of Light, in his "Compact" in search for Princess Mipple. Nagisa takes him outside to go look for the princess, but a mysterious man blocks their way in an amusement park, where Honoka and Mipple soon show up. The man tries to capture Mipple and Mepple, who tell Nagisa and Honoka to slide a card through the Compacts and transform into Pretty Cure. Nagisa changes into Cure Black, and Honoka into Cure White, and they fight the mysterious man and a roller coaster possessed by evil monster Zakenna. After they blast away the man and the monster, Mipple tells the perplexed girls that they are now Pretty Cure, protectors of the Light.

Episode 2: Give Us a Break! Darkness Invades the City

Nagisa learns from Mepple that he and Mipple come from the Garden of Light, a once peaceful kingdom that was protected by the Prism Stones. But one day, the kingdom was attacked by the evil Dotsuku Zone, whose leader, Jaaku King, stole five of their seven Prism Stones. Sensing serious danger, the Queen of the Garden of Light entrusted Mepple and Mipple with the remaining two Stones and sent them to Earth. On Earth, Pisard, the mysterious man from Dotsuku Zone, summons Zakenna and orders it to possess a vacuum cleaner. It starts sucking up energy from the city, causing blackouts and panic among the people. Nagisa and Honoka go outside to see what's causing the problem. They transform into Pretty Cure when they run into Pisard and the vacuum cleaner monster. They are almost sucked inside the monster and are

blown away by the strong wind, but finally manage to overpower it with their “Marble Screw.” As Pisard wonders if their immense power is the legendary “Power of the Light,” the city returns to normalcy.

Episode 3: Beware of the Handsome Intern Teacher

At school, Mipple and Mepple start calling out each other’s names right in front of Nagisa’s friends Shiho and Rina. To change the topic, Honoka invites Nagisa to her house to discuss the upcoming field trip for which they were elected as leaders. At Honoka’s house, Mipple and Mepple explain more in detail about the Prism Stones, the evil Dotsuku Zone, and why they escaped to the Garden of Rainbows, which is their name for Earth. The next day, a new intern teacher arrives at school. He is actually Pisard in disguise, who came to find Nagisa and Honoka. He hypnotizes Miss Yoshimi, their homeroom teacher, and makes her bring Nagisa to the gymnasium. Sensing something strange with their teacher’s behavior, Honoka follows them out the classroom. In the gymnasium, Pisard reveals his identity and summons Zakenna to attack Nagisa and Honoka, who transform into Pretty Cure. While trying to protect the spaced out Miss Yoshimi, Pretty Cure fights off Pisard and Zakenna. Nagisa and Honoka are relieved to see Miss Yoshimi regain her consciousness, until she starts scolding them for sneaking out of class.

Episode 4: A Miracle?! A Living Museum

It is the day of their field trip. On the way to the museum, Nagisa and Honoka’s classmate Mayu shyly recommends everyone to go look at the “Stardust Banquet” by Mario Piccalini, her favorite painter. In the museum, Mepple suddenly starts calling out for Mipple, and Nagisa runs away from her friends to calm him down. Coincidentally, she and Honoka run into each other in front of the “Stardust Banquet.” In the painting, Mipple sees herself painted in the picture among the shooting stars. The painting is 100 years old, but Mepple says he followed Mipple to Earth only a day after she took off. Honoka speculates that it is because time flows differently between Earth and the Garden of Lights. As the girls are about to head back to school, Pisard appears in the museum and starts changing the visitors into rock. He mistakes Mayu for Nagisa and attacks her. But suddenly Mayu is surrounded by light. . . Then Nagisa and Honoka arrive and transform into Pretty Cure. They fight Zakenna, who possesses the museum’s artwork. Although Pisard creates a tornado to shield himself from Pretty Cure’s attack, Nagisa and Honoka use their intuition to win the fight. Even after Pisard disappears, Mayu is nowhere to be seen until Nagisa and Honoka find her painted in

the “Stardust Banquet.” But suddenly Mayu is back in the museum and tells her surprised friends that she had a wonderful dream about her and the painter gazing up at the stars.

Episode 5: Totally Nasty! The Desperate Pisard

One Sunday, Nagisa takes Mepple out to go meet Mipple. While Mepple and Mipple play around in a park, Nagisa and Honoka carry on their “girl talk.” Although they have different personalities, Honoka really enjoys Nagisa’s company. On the other hand, Nagisa is still a bit uneasy about their contrasts. When Honoka arrives home, Pisard, desperate to clear his name of past failures, is waiting for her in front of the house. He chases her around town and steals Mipple from her. Right then, Nagisa shows up. Pisard, in order to maintain his pride, gives Mipple back to Honoka so that they could transform into Pretty Cure. The girls blast their “Marble Screw” toward Pisard, but being a desperate man, he puts up a good fight. Finally, Nagisa and Honoka overpower him. As he is blown away back into the darkness, he drops the green gem he was wearing around his neck, which turns out to be one of the lost Prism Stones.

Episode 6: A New Menace! The Savage Bear in the Woods

Nagisa and Honoka learn about the Prism Hopish, a container for the safekeeping of the Prism Stones. The Queen had given it to Mepple, but he dropped it near a “big puddle” when he entered the Earth’s atmosphere. The girls take Mepple to the library, where he recognizes Lake Hyotan on a map. Meanwhile, Jaaku King of Dotsuku Zone summons Gekidrago to replace Pisard in their quest for the remaining Prism Stones. Mipple, Mepple, and the girls set out to the lake to look for the lost Prism Hopish. On the way, Nagisa rescues a baby bear from the river and watches it go back into the wood with its mother. Then suddenly, Gekidrago comes barging at them, riding a bear possessed by Zakenna. The girls transform into Pretty Cure, but realize that the bear is actually the mother of the baby bear Nagisa saved. Not wanting to hurt the bear, they use “Pretty Cure Rainbow Therapy” to soothe the raging bear and to dispel Zakenna. Then with their “Marble Screw,” they attack Gekidrago and squash him under huge rocks. And from somewhere among the rocks, the lost Prism Hopish falls on Nagisa’s head. The Prism Hopish is guarded by a small man who calls himself the Stone Keeper. He gives the girls Pretty Cure Notebooks and a card with which they can summon him anytime they want.

Episode 7: Get Fired Up for Lacrosse! The Delicate Heart of a Girl

Nagisa psyches herself up for the lacrosse tournament starting that day, especially since Honoka told her that she'll be at the game to cheer her on. But as Nagisa looks up at the stands, she sees Honoka with Shogo Fujimura, the boy who she has a crush on! Seeing how close they seem to be, Nagisa cannot concentrate on the game, and her team loses the match. As Nagisa leaves the stadium, she finds Honoka waiting for her to cheer her up. But she can't get the image of her and Shogo out of her mind. . . The next day is the match that decides whether Nagisa's team can go on to the final league. But Gekidrago suddenly appears near the stadium. Horrified that he might disrupt the match, Honoka lures him away. Mepple senses the danger and warns Nagisa, who deserts the match to go help them. Nagisa and Honoka transform into Pretty Cure, but Gekidrago counterattacks by making Zakenna possess the vice principal. But the vice principle starts griping to Gekidrago, which gives Pretty Cure the opportunity to blast him away with "Marble Screw." While the girls hurry back to the match, Nagisa learns that Honoka and Shogo are just childhood friends. Relieved, Nagisa re-enters the match and leads her team to a comeback victory.

Episode 8: Pretty Cure Splits Up?! Already?!

Nagisa is still fretting over Shogo and Honoka. Despite what Honoka said, Nagisa is suspicious that they are more than just friends. . . On the other hand, Honoka hears from Mipple about Nagisa's crush on Shogo. The next day, trying to create an opportunity for Nagisa to get to know Shogo, she introduces the two to each other. But Nagisa gets angry, and tells her that it is none of her business. She also mouths off that they don't have anything in common except for being Pretty Cure together. Shocked, Honoka tells Nagisa that she can no longer be Pretty Cure with her. Nagisa regrets what she said and tries to make up, but to no avail. After school when Nagisa visits a shrine to pray for reconciliation, Gekidrago appears. Honoka coincidentally passes by the shrine, and she and Nagisa transform into Pretty Cure to fight him. Even during the fight, the girls keep arguing. They go home afterwards, still feeling uneasy. At home, they discover that they have taken the wrong Pretty Cure Notebook. They read what the other has written. Nagisa finds out that Honoka has fun when they're together, and Honoka learns that Nagisa wants to get to know her better. The next day, as they return the Notebooks to each other, they make up and call each other by their first names for the very first time (a sign of closeness between people in Japan).

Episode 9: Get Him Back! Operation Mepo-Mepo

Nagisa is starting to get sick of being bossed around by Mepple, and one morning, she refuses to give him breakfast and doesn't believe him when he says he's not feeling well. At school, however, she finds out that he really is sick. But thinking that Mepple is a cell phone, which is prohibited at school, the vice principal takes him away from Nagisa. Mipple is distressed! She tells Nagisa and Honoka that Earth is actually a tough environment for them to live in. Regretting how mean she was to Mepple that morning, Nagisa tries, unsuccessfully, to get him back by disguising herself and sneaking into the teachers' office. So the girls decide to stake out in front of the office until the vice principal leaves. He finally does so after dark, but he takes Mipple with him instead of leaving him in the office. On the way out, he stops by the Science Room where he is confronted by a human anatomy model possessed by Zakenna. It steals Mepple and gives it to Gekidrago waiting outside. Tearfully, Nagisa begs Gekidrago to let her cure the ailing Mepple. Gekidrago hesitantly gives him back to Nagisa, only to be blown away by "Marble Screw" after the girls change into Pretty Cure. Finally, Mepple is given a shot that relieves his fever. The next morning, Nagisa and he start their friendly fights again.

Episode 10: Honoka Gets Psyched Up! A Lovely Birthday

Once a year on Honoka's birthday, her parents return to Japan with a mountain of presents. Honoka meets them at the airport, and they talk happily about how they are going to spend the day together. But Honoka's father receives a call on his cell phone, and the family makes a stop at a jewelry shop to take care of some business. While Honoka waits for her parents to finish the meeting, the shop is attacked by burglars. Angry with these people who seem to think nothing about stealing other people's belongings, Honoka starts preaching to them. But the burglars are actually good people who are just down on luck. Then suddenly, Gekidrago appears and demands Honoka to give him the Prism Stones. Meanwhile, Nagisa is trying to think of what to get Honoka for her birthday. She has already used up her allowance and has no money to buy her anything. But after being reminded by Mepple that the important thing is the thought and not the price, she decides to make her a charm shaped like Mepple and Mipple. Later, on the news, Nagisa sees Mipple in the window of the burgled jewelry shop, and realizes that Honoka is in there too. Nagisa sneaks into the shop through the air duct, and Pretty Cure blasts away Gekidrago once again. Before she sneaks back outside, Nagisa gives the charm to Honoka, who declares that this has been the best birthday of her life.

Episode 11: Save Ryota! The Gekidrago Panic

Ryota begs Nagisa to take him to the aquarium so he can write a report for his science class. Honoka, who loves aquariums, joins them. As they are observing the different kinds of fish and having a good time, Gekidrago awaits a chance to attack them. He makes Zakenna possess the sharks, which slam themselves against the glass tanks and break them. The visitors evacuate the premises, but Nagisa, Honoka, and Ryota are locked in. Nagisa tells Ryota to hide and wait under a counter while they go look for an emergency exit. Nagisa and Honoka go to the pool outside, where they confront Gekidrago who transforms into a fish monster. The girls also transform into Pretty Cure. Then Ryota, who was worried about his sister, shows up at the pool. He passes out after being attacked by Gekidrago, which greatly angers Nagisa. The girls defeat Gekidrago, who is blown away back into the darkness and leaves behind a Prism Stone.

Episode 12: Poisonny the Flower of Evil! (Who's That?!)

One day, Nagisa finds a chocolate stand giving out free samples of chocolate. Chocolate being her favorite food, Nagisa is elated. The chocolate stand is however a ploy to distract Nagisa while Poisonny, from Dotsuku Zone, steals Mepple. Poisonny also approaches Honoka in a park by pretending to be a gentle old woman, just like Honoka's grandmother. She is almost successful in stealing Mipple, but Honoka's real grandmother, Sanae, arrives in time to blow Poisonny's disguise. Poisonny tries to attack Sanae too, but somehow Sanae gains power when she holds Mipple in her hands. She staves off Poisonny's attack, but passes out afterwards. Mepple manages to escape from Poisonny, and the girls transform into Pretty Cure. After the fight, Nagisa and Honoka are afraid that Sanae might have seen them as Pretty Cure, but Sanae says that she doesn't remember seeing a thing. However, back at her house as she greets Chutaro, the dog, Sanae points her finger, just like Pretty Cure, and says, "It's time to go home"...

Episode 13: Beware! The New Younger Boy in School

Kiria is a new student in the Boys' Division of Verone Academy. He is in the grade below Nagisa and Honoka, and is an excellent soccer player. He immediately becomes the prime subject of the girls' conversations. He is however Poisonny's little brother, who is waiting for his chance to steal the Prism Stones. Kiria approaches Nagisa and Honoka and make an impression of himself as a nice, young boy. Meanwhile, Honoka and the other members of the Science Club enter their project in a science contest. But

during the contest, Poisonny makes Zakenna possess the machine they made. The audience, including Fuji P, evacuates the auditorium. But Yuriko, a member of the Science Club, is left behind and tries to stop Pretty Cure from destroying the machine they worked so hard to make. After Pretty Cure makes Zakenna leave the machine, Honoka and Nagisa talk Yuriko into believing that what she saw was just a dream. However, they do not realize that they were also witnessed by Natsuko and Kyoko who accidentally stayed inside the auditorium during the fight.

Episode 14: Real? Phony? Pretty Cure Wannabes

One day in school, Nagisa and Honoka find out that Pretty Cure is the talk of the town. Natsuko and Kyoko seem to be quite familiar with them, discussing in detail the personality and appearance of Cure Black and Cure White. Even Akane, the former captain of the lacrosse team, knows about them, and tells Nagisa and Honoka that she saw them just yesterday. At this point, Nagisa and Honoka realize they are dealing with imposters, because they did not transform into Pretty Cure yesterday. On their way home, they run into these imposters, who turn out to be Natsuko and Kyoko. They explain that they are pretending to be Pretty Cure to entertain the children in the park. Nagisa and Honoka try to make them stop, without telling them that they might be attacked by Dotsuku Zone by mistake. Natsuko and Kyoko refuse and even get mad at Nagisa and Honoka. But just as Nagisa and Honoka feared, Natsuko and Kyoko fall into Poisonny's trap. After the real Pretty Cure saves them, Natsuko and Kyoko vow not to copy or to talk about Pretty Cure anymore. But alas, Nagisa and Honoka see them in the park the very next day, proudly doing their Pretty Cure routine for the children.

Episode 15: A Totally Dangerous Family Vacation

Nagisa and her family go on vacation to a lake in the mountains. Coincidentally, Honoka and her grandmother Sanae are staying at the same creepy old inn. The innkeeper tells the girls an old story about the island in the middle of the lake. It is about two samurais who kill each other over a young woman, who, in her grief over the loss of the two men, turns into a pine tree. The innkeeper also tells them that if they pray to the sun setting behind the pine tree, their wishes will come true. Curious, the girls decide to visit the island, but without telling their families. On the island, the girls find the pine tree and the two shrines in which the armors of the two samurais are enshrined. But Zakenna possesses the armors and attacks the girls. Meanwhile, back at the inn, Nagisa's parents and Honoka's grandmother are getting worried about the girls, who have not returned for dinner. After Ryota reveals where they are, Nagisa's

father decides to go to the island to look for them. On the island, the girls are almost defeated by the possessed armors when a sound of a flute is heard from nowhere. It is the flute of the young woman, whose spirit still resides inside the pine tree. It makes Zakenna leave the armors, which quietly return to their shrines. When Nagisa's father finds them, he gets mad at Nagisa for not telling them where she was going. Nagisa is shook up by his unusually harsh words. But she feels happy later on when she realizes that he was angry because he loved her more than anything in the world.

Episode 16: Stressed Out! It's Not Easy Being a Superstar

Yuka Odajima is Verone Academy's superstar. She is a gifted athlete and is also smart, beautiful, and rich. She envies the other girls though, like Nagisa and Honoka, who are carefree and are enjoying life as "normal" teenagers. But Yuka keeps herself in tight control in order to maintain her superstar image. Poisonny senses Yuka's frustration and makes Zakenna possess her shadow. Zakenna turns into many Yukas, who start playing around like little children in the park. Nagisa and Honoka realize that Dotsuku Zone is behind this, and follow Poisonny to an auto junkyard. But they are attacked by the multiple Yukas. The girls cannot fight back because the real Yuka is among them although they don't know which one. But White turns on the lights in the junkyard, which makes the fake Yukas disappear. When the fake ones reappear, Nagisa makes silly drawings on the real Yuka's face in order to distinguish her from the rest. They fight Zakenna and overpower it once again. The next day at school, Nagisa can't stop laughing when she sees Yuka and remembers how funny the superstar looked with all the silly drawings on her face the day before.

Episode 17: Capture His Heart! Getting Heady With Farm Work

Nagisa, Honoka, Kimata, Fuji P, and Kiria travel to the countryside to help Kimata's grandparents pick vegetables from the fields. Nagisa pairs up with Fuji P, but she is so nervous that she gets too tongue-tied to carry on a decent conversation. Honoka works with Kiria, who doesn't understand why humans work hard or why they cooperate with each other. Honoka scolds him for goofing off, and Kiria at first resents her. But Honoka's kindness touches him when she gets so concerned about a little cut on his finger. Meanwhile, Nagisa borrows the Prism Love Checker from Mepple and Mipple. It is a device that shows how much two people are in love with each other. She tries it on Kimata's grandparents, who, unlike Mepple and Mipple, always seem to be at odds with each other. But the device shows that they are indeed in love, which leads Nagisa to believe that the device is inaccurate. Then Poisonny appears, and Zakenna attacks

the grandparents' house. Grandpa valiantly protects Grandma and fights off the monster. Kiria, trying to prove himself to Poisonny, creates a wall to prevent Black from helping White, but when he remembers Honoka's kindness, his power dissipates. Later, when the girls witness the grandparents' concern for each other, they realize there are many different ways to express one's love for another person.

Episode 18: Hearts Pounding! Heartache During Mid-Terms

Seiko, Nagisa and Honoka's classmate, has developed a big crush on Kiria and decides to give him a letter that expresses how she feels. But Kiria is confused about human feelings and their kindness toward each other, which he is unexpectedly starting to feel towards Honoka. He refuses to accept Seiko's letter, which he tears in half, and is enraged to find out that Honoka has actually encouraged Seiko's actions. On the other hand, Honoka was not aware that Seiko was talking about Kiria when the subject was brought up among the girls. She was angry at Kiria for hurting Seiko's feelings, but later reproached herself for not thinking about Kiria's feelings. Then, right as mid-term exams are about to begin, Poisonny traps Nagisa and Honoka in a different dimension, a world of mirrors. But to Poisonny's confusion, the girls somehow escape, and they return to school just in time to take the exams. After school that day, Honoka learns from Seiko that Kiria had approached her earlier to apologize for not responding to her feelings. She says he was even a bit taken aback, when Seiko thanked him for his sincerity.

Episode 19: Too Scary! Dotsuku Zone's Final Ace

One day, Mepple and Mipple get into a huge argument. Mipple insults Mepple for not acting like the brave Chosen One from the Garden of Light, and Mepple in turn tells Mipple that she is not acting like the Princess of Hope. That night, they both regret what they said to each other, but still cannot bring themselves to apologize the next day. Then suddenly, Dotsuku Zone's strongest henchman Ilkubo appears and, using a crystal ball, he starts sucking up the life force of the town. The girls transform into Pretty Cure but is no match for Ilkubo. He even sucks up the Power of the Light from Pretty Cure and dissolves their transformation. The girls and Mipple are ready to give up but Mepple valiantly attacks Ilkubo by himself. His bravery makes the crystal ball crack, and Pretty Cure regains their strength. With added power from the earth's life force, Pretty Cure blasts away Ilkubo with Marble Screw. Later, Mipple and Mepple apologize to each other and make up, once again becoming the lovey-dovey couple they really are.

Episode 20: Which Is Real? The Two Honokas

In Dotsuku Zone, Jaaku King is getting increasingly frustrated about the Prism Stones, and Poisonny hardens her resolve about bringing them to him. She transforms herself into Honoka in order to trick Nagisa. Nagisa is fooled at first, but realizes that she is not the real Honoka when she mistakes Mipple for Mepple. Nagisa leaves her immediately, but runs into both Honokas on the train. They both try to convince her that she is the real one. Nagisa finally distinguishes the real Honoka when she mentions something that Nagisa wrote in her Pretty Cure notebook. They escape to a warehouse district, but Poisonny comes right after them. Her determination is extraordinarily strong this time, and the girls are being overpowered. Finally however, they manage to blast her away, this time forever into the darkness. And she leaves behind the Prism Stone she was wearing around her neck. Kiria senses his sister's disappearance into the darkness and becomes very distressed.

Episode 21: A Shocking Date! The Truth About Kiria

One day after school, as Kiria and Honoka are walking home together, Kiria reveals that he is from Dotsuku Zone. Honoka is shocked and saddened at the same time, and tells Nagisa, Mepple and Mipple what she heard. Nagisa also finds that hard to believe since Kiria has never attacked them even though he has had many opportunities to do so. That evening, Honoka receives a message from Kiria to meet him by the river early the next day. There, the girls try to persuade him to try to change his destiny, but Kiria attacks them anyway. The girls transform into Pretty Cure but refuse to use the Marble Screw on their friend. Kiria remembers the good times he had at school and with Honoka and the others, and his emotions sway back and forth. In the end, he loses the will to fight them and give them his Prism Stone. For defying Jaaku King, Kiria quietly disappears into the world of darkness. The girls, especially Honoka, are heartbroken but find consolation in Kiria's courage to stand up against his dark destiny, which he showed by surrendering his Prism Stone to the girls.

Episode 22: No Way! Chutaro Becomes a Mom?!

One day, Chutaro finds a lost puppy by the river. He brings him home to Honoka's house and takes care of him. When Honoka and Nagisa find the puppy, they decide to take him back to his owner whose address is written on his collar. However, the family has moved, and the neighbors don't know their new address. Hearing that the boy in the family likes the planetarium, the girls decide to go there to look for clues. At the planetarium, Nagisa convinces Honoka to watch the show instead of looking for the

puppy's family. But they are attacked by Zakenna and later by Ilkubo. Ilkubo demands to know where the Prism Stones are kept. And when the girls tell him that they are in a safe place, guarded in another dimension by the Stone Keeper, he mutters the Stone Keeper's real name, Wisdom, which the girls didn't even know. Then he disappears after telling them that he will be back again soon. Meanwhile, Chutaro finds the boy's new address, and the puppy is happily reunited with his family.

Episode 23: Danger! A Nightmare at Summer Camp

Nagisa and the lacrosse team are in summer training session in the mountains. Honoka is also there with the Science Club. They are staying in a lodge surrounded by nature, near a beautiful lake and a river. One night, there is a mysterious power failure at the lodge. And the next day, the leaves change color even though it's in the middle of summer, and the lake and river dry up. Nagisa and Honoka realize it is the work of Dotsuku Zone, and proving them right, Ilkubo shows up. He urges the girls to transform into Pretty Cure because the energy of the legendary warriors provides the key to finding the Stone Keeper. Unaware of the trap, the girls transform and attack Ilkubo with Marble Screw, thereby giving him the opportunity to force the Stone Keeper out of the other dimension. After he tells the stunned girls that he will be back for the remaining two stones, Ilkubo disappears into the air taking with him the Stone Keeper and the Prism Hopish.

Episode 24: The Final Battle! Pretty Cure vs. Ilkubo

Nagisa and Honoka return to the lodge and try to summon the Stone Keeper with the Stone Keeper card, but to no avail. The next morning, they find that everybody else in the lodge has fallen into a deep sleep and will not wake up no matter how they try to wake them. Then Ilkubo appears and tells them he has sucked up their friends' life force with his crystal ball. Nagisa and Honoka transform into Pretty Cure to fight him, but they seem to be no match for this powerful adversary. He even succeeds in taking Mepple's and Mipple's Prism Stone. Ilkubo now has all seven Prism Stones. But instead of making him invincible as he believed they would, the stones' power overwhelms him and makes him vulnerable to Pretty Cure's Marble Screw. Defeated at last, he disappears into the darkness. Back at Honoka's house, the seven Prism Stones are placed inside the Prism Hopish when suddenly a huge rainbow appears in the sky. Then a ball of light comes rolling down the rainbow, which turns out to be Pollun, the Prince of the Light from the Garden of Light. He stubbornly insists that Pretty Cure go back to the Garden of Light with him.
